What Is 'Arts Award'?

- A nationally recognised qualification
 - *There are 5 levels of Arts Award (Explore, Discover, Bronze, Silver and Gold), four of which are accredited qualifications on the Qualifications and Credit Framework.*
- A way of recognising and rewarding your hard work and commitment to arts activities
- Builds your skills, knowledge and confidence
- Good for your CV



Who Can Do An Arts Award?

- Young people age 7-25 can take part. (Bronze, Silver and Gold are only open to people aged 11+)
- There are no entry requirements and no time limits to complete it.
- This term it will be offered to Years 7 – 10 at TAA



What Do You Have To Do?

For the Bronze Arts Award you have to:

- 1) Take part in a arts activity
- 2) Go to an arts event
- 3) Research an arts hero/heroine
- 4) Share your skills with others
- 5) Put together a portfolio or log/diary in any format showing evidence of all of the above

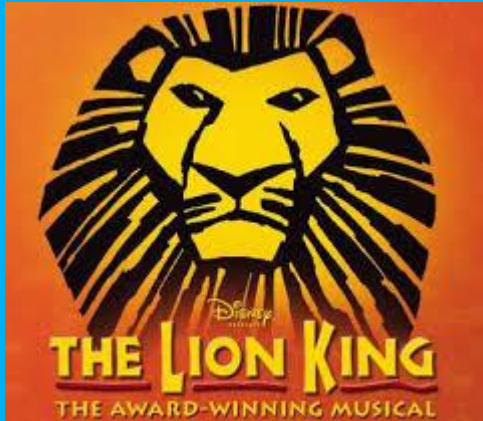

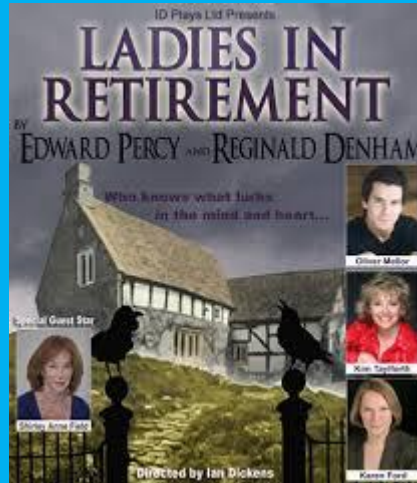
