Private Maurice Newberry was the twin brother of an E.A.S. employé now engaged on Army contract work, the father of these brave brothers having also been employed at this factory for a lengthy term of years.

A sergeant of the Herts. Regiment has written to Mrs. Maurice Newberry, informing her that her husband was killed instantly in action. The platoon-sergeant says he grieves for him as a personal friend, and his chums likewise grieve for him, feeling they have lost a good man and a comrade. He hopes the way her husband was appreciated by the Company generally will be some consolation to her in a great bereavement.
